- 1) I would really like to see a regular meeting of the consortium (twice annually) to share, plan, and create more opportunities for exchange between the members in addition to collaborations.
- 2) Bringing in speakers; grant-writing seminars; connecting with similar programs at other universities for idea-sharing.
- 3) It would be nice to have a UT K-12 Colloquium. The event could be a one day mini-conference for K-12 educators that features one main guest speaker and a variety of workshops with UT professors and K-12 experts giving lectures. I think it would promote community and sharing of ideas on a grand scale and what a great way for UT to welcome the K-12 community.
